Trip 2 had a fantastic visit to Conisbrough Castle! The children were fully immersed in the experience as we prepared for the king's arrival.


Everyone enjoyed dressing up in medieval costumes, which really brought the history to life.

This week in Year 1, the children have been busy building their understanding of numbers through fun and interactive activities all about greater than (>), less than (<), and equal to (=).

Using number cards, counters, cubes – and even some crocodile props – the children learned how to compare numbers and identify which is bigger, smaller, or the same. They especially enjoyed using the "greedy crocodile," who always wants to eat the bigger number!

Through games, hands-on tasks, and partner challenges, the children have grown in confidence and are now much quicker at recognising which number is greater or less – and explaining their reasoning too!

It's been a joy to see their enthusiasm and teamwork throughout the week. Well done, Year 1!










# Finding out what blood is made up of!
