We had a special assembly to celebrate the Safer Streets Project and to say thank you to the children who took part.


The assembly was attended by the Parking Services and by local councillors Tom Hunt and Laura McClean.

We are very grateful to all the families who engaged with the project and continue to support us in keeping the school gates free from traffic.




ATTENDANCE MATTERS

Exploring the wonderful world of maps


Year 4 'Takes Over' at the National Videogame Museum!


Year 4 had an amazing experience last week as they participated in the Kids in Museums Takeover Day at the National Videogame Museum in Sheffield city centre.

As always, Attendabear is eager for more adventures and learning opportunities in the coming weeks! Stay tuned for more updates on Attendabear's journey at St. Mary's




Year 3

What do owls eat?


Owls eat woodlice, mice and worms. They love to eat spiders but not fruit and veg. Did you know owls also eat snakes!
