We are delighted to have been accepted on the Grow Smart pilot program for Food Growing with Sheffield Schools, supported by Learn Sheffield and Food Works. We have collected our first plants for the school garden, and all the lovely new planters in the KS1 yard should soon be full of flowers, herbs and vegetables. Many thanks to Maddy and all the team at Food Works Norton for supporting nature-friendly food-growing in our city.



Year 5 were really lucky this week as we had a special visit from a real-life scientist! Professor Aimee Ambrose, from Sheffield Hallam University, visited us to talk all about energy. The children were shocked to find out that 200 famous buildings in Sheffield (including the hospitals, museums and leisure centres) get their energy from burning the rubbish that we put in our black bins. We talked about the pros and cons of this and the children also learnt a lot about renewable and non-renewable energy. This is all part of a larger project in which the children study how we consume energy in schools and whether it would be beneficial for us to install solar panels at St.Mary's. Really interesting stuff!

Building vocabulary and creativity with descriptive discussions

This week, Year 5 have started a new unit of learning all about 3D art forms.

In our first lesson, we looked at the work of the famous sculptor, Barbara Hepworth.


We tried to interpret who the subject of each piece was and what might have been happening in her life at the time that she made it.

The children had some really interesting insights.

Willow said she thought a piece called Motherhood was about "how love is infinite" which I thought was really lovely.

In our second lesson, we learnt that sometimes sculptors use something called an armature which strengthens their sculptures. We used plastic bowls as our own armature and built a papier mâché bowls around them.

I was really impressed by how carefully the children constructed their bowls. A massive well done, Year 5!

Getting hands-on with imaginative art

Year 2 students have been getting hands-on with a fun and imaginative art project — potato printing! Using carved potatoes and a variety of vibrant paints, the children explored printmaking techniques to create bold and colourful patterns.

Foundation Learning about numbers


The children in Foundation Stage have been learning all about numbers this week.
